# SNZ TAC Appointments:

Congratulations to Jasmine Hardy-Mills who has been appointed to the Swimming New Zealand Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

The TAC is a committee of two technical officials from each zone (one with 10yrs or less experience and one with more than 10yrs experience) to advise the CEO of SNZ about Technical Official matters including rules, and training of technical officials.

Jasmine joins Hugh Allan (National Referee from the Tawa club) on the committee.

Thanks to Greg Forsythe (Capital) who was on the previous TAC that covered Wellington and Hawkes Bay Poverty Bay Regions.

The previous TAC was disbanded due to the change in terms of reference from setting the Swimming NZ rules based on the rules from World Aquatics (previously FINA) and providing training and the qualification of National Technical Officials, to now advising the CEO on what the rules should be, and how training should be managed.

#### PCA Novice Carnival:

Sunday 2 April 2023 at Cannons Creek Pool. 1:30pm, warm up for a 2:00pm start

Come along and "HAVE A GO" - an introduction to racing

Races are held in single age groups from 6 years and under up to 11 years and over, over 25m and 50m, in freestyle and backstroke only.

This meet is an introduction to racing, targeting swimmers newer club members and swimmers who have not raced in three or more zone or interclub events. All swimmers 8 years and under are considered 'Novice swimmers' and are eligible to enter. Swimmers 9 and over who have qualified to swim at the Wellington Champs may not enter. Events run with in our club for our club members only (race nights, Club Champs, In House league etc) are not counted as meets for eligibility.

Every effort will be made by the officials to put swimmers at ease and to ensure they enjoy their first swim meet. The club will appoint a team manager to look after the Porirua City Aquatics team at the meet. The team should sit together with the team manager. Parents should sit away from the team.

All those competing will receive a 'participant' ribbon. Swimmers will swim each event they enter once, and the times will be collated, should there be more than one heat, to rank the swimmers – in swimming this is known as timed finals. Ribbons will be presented to those who place first, second or third overall in each event.

Full details and entry instructions are on the noticeboard and on the flyer which can be found on our website. Entries close on 26 March. While the flyer asks swimmers to enter through Fastlane PCA swimmers who don't have a log-in should contact Viv

# Meet Reports:

# Wellington Summer Champs:

This meet was held over the Wellington Anniversary Weekend in January at WRAC

While most families were on holiday in January, our 13 and over competitive swimmers were back in the pool training for the Wellington Long Course Championships held at Kilbirnie over Anniversary weekend. This was a long course meet, held in a 50m length pool – meets swum in 25m pools are known as short course meets.

For many of our twelve swimmers this meet was a huge learning curve with multi-age heats swum in the morning and then the fastest 10 heat swimmers competed in the evening final. The longer races (400m, 800 and 1500m) were swum as timefinals.

Thirty two teams were represented at the meet, with many coming from the South Island to race in a 50m pool. 50m racing is the South Island is limited and expensive.

PCA finished  $14^{th}$  on the top team points table, and was the  $6^{th}$  Wellington Club. Pirates (Wellington) were the

overall winners. All finalists contributed to the team scores.

Individually PCA had some really good swims with David Zhu (16yrs) breaking the Wellington record for 50m butterfly – his time of 25.78 was under the previous time of 26.14seconds set in April 2019.

Thank you to Elouise Thomas who organised our helpers and then officiated most of the meet, and our many officials who turned up even when they didn't have swimmers competing.

Jackson Crawford and Patrick Reiher, both too young to compete made special memories at the meet, rubbing shoulders and chatting to some of NZ's Commonwealth Games swimmers when they helped in the presentation area – an experience they will always remember.

# Swim Wellington Tier 1 Long Course Meet:

This meet was held at WRAC on Friday 17 February.

Tier 1 meets are usually restricted to swimmers 13 and over , but as a first this meet was open to swimmers 12 years old, to give swimmers value racing experience and official times in the long course/50m pool.

As a designated meet (meaning a full deck of officials were in place) many swimmers were chasing qualifying times for the upcoming National Meets - Age Groups which are to be held in Hastings from 12/16 April and SNZ's Division II meet to be held in Wellington 16/20 May 2023.

PCA's team of 23 was the biggest we have ever had at a Tier one Meet, with most swimmers achieving personal best long course times.

David Zhu was in outstanding form breaking the Wellington record for 16 year old 100m butterfly with a









time of 56.75. The previous time of 57.19 was set in April 2018.

Our thanks go to the team managers, coaches and all those who officiated and took care of PCA duties.

#### Subscriptions:

The membership year begins on 1 July, and subs for the year are:

- \$195.00 for club members. That is, those who swim in the Tadpoles squads and those who swim at the club sessions on Friday and/or Monday nights and/or Sunday mornings.
- \$150.00 for squad members, being those in the Senior squad, Orcas, Sharks, Swordfish, Seals, Penguins and those who swim in PCA's Johnsonville squad.

Subs can be paid directly into the PCA bank account 030547-0205093-00 - please use the swimmers name as a reference, or can be paid at the duty desk on a Monday or Friday night, or left in a named envelope in the black letterbox on our storeroom door.

Annual Subs are due on 1 July and should be paid as soon as possible.

For new members joining during the year the sub is prorated based on the month of joining, and if the swimmer is a squad or competitive swimmer. These rates are available from the Treasurer or the Committee Member on the desk on Monday and Friday club nights.

# Swimmers are required to be financial members to enter swim meets and attend training nights (club and squad) and to attend and vote at the AGM or other club meetings.

Some leeway will be provided for the attendance at training as long as the annual sub is paid by 31 July, within four weeks of joining if a new member, or are on an agreed payment plan and no payments have been missed.

There is no leeway for entering swim meets or being able to vote at club meetings. You must be a paid up member to participate in swim meets and club meetings.

# PCA Swimming Caps:
