During the meeting presentations were made to our volunteer coaches, qualified officials and team managers who have taken the PCA teams away, as well as Karen Johnston and Jasmine Hardy-Mills who both stood down from the committee. Karen and Jasmine have each made a huge, valuable and much appreciated contribution to PCA and the committee in recent years.

PCA does require a few more people on the committee, and if we had a person with an interest in bookkeeping/accounts in our club who may like to become PCA's treasurer that would be great!

This is the smallest committee I have ever presided over. For a big club like PCA, we do need more people to step up to spread the load. Specials skills are not required - just need a passion for swimming and a degree in common sense!

During the meeting a presentation was made to **Bronagh Ryan**, probably our most successful swimmer who recently hung up her racing togs to continue her interest in surf.

The earliest result that could be found for Bronagh was a swim at a Gold Coast meet in 2005 where at 11 yrs old she swum 50m breaststroke in 54.58. Evidently, she also swum 100 breaststroke that day and was disqualified!

Since that early swim Bronagh has been on quite a journey and swum at numerous meets in NZ and overseas and has won a number of National titles.

She represented NZ with success at the Oceania Games in 2016 and again in 2018, and at the Commonwealth Games in Brisbane in 2018.

Bronagh was selected to swim in NZ women's medley relay team at the Commonwealth Games and was then able to enter individual races.

Swimmers should never underestimate the value of being a good relay swimmer because that is why Bronagh was on the team. In 2016 and 2017 she broke the NZ Women's Open Short Course record for 100m Breaststroke three times.

One of these records was swum at WRAC – what an exciting race to watch. Currently Bronagh holds Women's Wellington records, both long and short course for 50m and 100m breaststroke set between 2016 and 2018.

#### **Meet Reports:**

#### National Age Groups 2024 (13 to 18 yrs):

In the first week of the school holidays PCA took a team to Hawkes Bay for the NZ Age Group National Champs. PCA'S 12 swimmers had worked exceptionally hard to meet the tough qualifying times for this event.

Our team was Joe Reiher, Felix Thomas, Eric Yuan, Holly Sorenson, Frederick Mills, Lauren Crawford, Alyssa Bai, Dannielle Rule, Lewis Parker, Justin Wang, Patrick Reiher and Asher Thomas. We also had three Team Managers - Rose Crawford, Jasmine Hardy-Mills and Catherine Liu, Coach – Gerusio, Matonse and one official - Brent Harris.

It was a 7 day trip, 5 days of competition with morning and evening sessions. The morning sessions were the heats, and the evening were the age groups finals. PCA ended up 20th out of 70 clubs in the age group points results, an impressive result for our 12 swimmers.

There was an awesome atmosphere at the pool and our team put in impressive performances. We had some wonderful results including 7 Medals, 45 great PBs from the 72 individual swims and we also entered 6 relay teams.

It was great to see the relationships between the swimmers grow over the week. A big thanks to Brent for Officiating the entire meet, Gerusio for coaching and supporting our swimmers, Jasmine for cooking and Rose & Catherine for team managing.

Thanks also to the PCA families who did provided a plate of food to keep the officials refreshed. The officials were certainly fed well!

As you would expect a lot of works goes in prior to a meet like – thanks to Elouise for organising the entries and Blair and Brent - the officials.

It was great to see most of those who PCA supported to recent National Meets and other Senior Squad swimmers along encouraging the PCA team and helping out.

The criteria for this meet allows developing swimmers to shine. Overall, the PCA team did very well with many standing in the podium for the very first time. Medals were presented to the first three in each race with those finishing 4<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> receiving a finalist ribbon.









PCA dominated the boys 10yr old age group with Lincoln Thomas, Lawrence Wang, Chao Wang and Alastair Bai swimming some exciting races that saw them share the podium a number of times.

A big thank you also goes to PCA's team managers Rose and JayMi and coach Todd Morton for guiding the swimmers.

#### Swimming NZ Div II:

PCA's team of six along with managers, Becky St Just and JayMi Ng travelled to Hamilton to swim at this 5 day, held from 7 to 11 May.

Just qualifying to go to this meet is a tremendous achievement – Congratulations to the PCA team - Cody Chen, Jade Lin, Jayden Ng, Dannielle Rule, Maddy St Just and Daniel Turetsky

The PCA team did really well finishing 18<sup>th</sup> out of 77 on the club points table. Everyone finishing in the top 8 earned points for the club.

Like National Age Groups heats were held in the morning with finals swum in the afternoon sessions. The 800m and 1500m events were swum as timed finals.

Medals weren't on offer instead swimmers were presented with extra-long placing ribbons.

Jayden Ng 14yrs, 1st 50m freestyle, 2nd 50m backstroke, 3rd 200m backstroke.

Cody Chen 13yrs, 2<sup>nd</sup> 50m breast, 3<sup>rd</sup> 100m butterfly. Jade Lin 17yrs, 2<sup>nd</sup> 100m butterfly.

Daniel Turetsky 14yrs, 2<sup>nd</sup> 800m freestyle.

Those to finish 4<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> were Dannielle Rule 9 events, Jade Lin, Jayden Ng, Maddy St Just and Daniel Turetsky one each. Dannielle had a very heavy schedule of ten events. To finish in the top for nine of these was a great result.

Thanks to the managers for rearranging their families for a week, and also to Natalia Turetsky who helped with the cooking for a few days.

#### **Gold Coast Meet:**

PCA hosted this meet on Mother's Day (12 May) at the Tawa Pool.

PCA had by far the biggest team with 52 of the 85 swimmers competing. Other swimmers came from Raumati and Tawa Swimming clubs.

It was great to see a number of new swimmers taking part in their first Gold Coast while many swimmers swum new events for the first time.

PCA did extremely well winning the Personal Best Time trophy with 73% of our swimmer's races being swum in a PB. Raumati was second with 56% with Tawa close behind on 54%.

Winning a PB's Ribbons is the goal at Gold Coast Meets and while some PB's were a few splits, Congratulation goes to Livvy Andrews, Madison D'Oliveira, Indigo Eastham, Ashley Liu, Amokura Olsen, Hugo Pearce, Lincoln Thomas, Justin Wang, Nathaniel Wood and Elizabeth Yang who all achieved PBs in excess of 8 seconds.

A big vote of thanks goes to coaches Steven and Gerusio for guiding our swimmers, the PCA team managers and everyone who officiated or helped with duties.

Thanks especially to PCA's Senior officials who continue to support the club.

#### **Swim Wellington Long Distance Champs:**

This meet held at Coastlands on 25 May and was particularly successful for PCA's team of 19 swimmers.

There were only two events on the programme, with boys and girl swimming separately – 800m (32 lengths) and 1500m (60 lengths) freestyle.

For a number of swimmers this was the first time they had raced these distances while others were aiming to PR

#### **Subscriptions:**

The membership year begins on 1 July, and subs for the year are:

- \$200.00 for club members. That is, those who swim in the Tadpoles squad and those who swim at the club sessions on Friday and/or Monday nights and/or Sunday mornings.
- \$160.00 for squad members, being those in the Senior squad, Orcas, Sharks, Swordfish, Seals and those who swim in PCA's Johnsonville squad.

Subs can be paid directly into the PCA bank account 030547-0205093-00 – please use the swimmers name as a reference, or can be paid at the duty desk on a Monday or Friday night, or left in a named envelope in the black letterbox on our storeroom door.

Annual Subs are due on 1 July and should be paid as soon as possible.

For new members joining during the year the sub is prorated based on the month of joining, and if the swimmer is a squad or competitive swimmer. These rates are available from the Treasurer or the Committee Member on the desk on Monday and Friday club nights.

Swimmers are required to be financial members to enter swim meets and attend training nights (club and squad) and to attend and vote at the AGM or other club meetings.

Some leeway will be provided for the attendance at training as long as the annual sub is paid by 31 July, within four weeks of joining if a new member, or are on an agreed payment plan and no payments have been missed.

There is no leeway for entering swim meets or being able to vote at club meetings. You must be a paid up member to participate in swim meets and club meetings.

#### **PCA Swimming Caps:**

New members will be given a cap on receipt of their first subscription payment.

Caps are replaced free of charge if they split, on presentation of the damaged cap.

The cost of caps are \$10 each if a swimmer requires another cap.

It would not normally be expected that any swimmer would need more than 1 or 2 caps each year.

Caps can be obtained from the sign-in desk at Monday and Friday night club sessions (at Cannons Creek) or the Team Manager at swim meets.

#### Club Uniform:

The club orders uniform items several times a year based on the demand. The items that are available for order (and order forms) are on the notice board at Cannons Creek Pool and on the Website.

Items ordered must be paid for before the items will be included in an order sent to our supplier.
